





Samosas are one of the most commonly eaten snacks across India. There are many regional varieties, however a samosa is always a crisp fried pastry with a savory filling, usually potatoes, spices and herbs, and sometimes minced meat. 5.3

Samosas Ingredients l tablespoon vegetable oil l onion, finely chopped 2 garlic cloves, crushed 3 potatoes, boiled 100 g peas, boiled 2 teaspoons curry powder plus other spices according to taste, usually cumin, garam masala, red chili power, coriander . • FOR THE PASTRY: 250 flour, 2 teaspoons salt, 50 ml vegetable oil, 100 ml water • To make the pastry, mix flour and salt into a bowl. Incorporate the oil to make the pastry, mix nour and sait into a bowly incorporate the oil and gradually add water. Knead the dough on a floured surface for 5 minutes until smooth and roll into a ball. Cover and set aside at room temperature. Heat the oil in a frying pan, add the onion and garlie, mix in the spices and Method freat the on in a trying pan, and the onion and garne, mix in the spices and fry for 10 mins until soft, stirring frequently. Add the vegetables, coarsely crushed, seasoning and stir well until coated. Leave to cool. Divide the dough into 5 equal parts. Roll each piece into a ball and roll out into a circle of 20 cm. Divide the circle into two equal parts. Brush each straight edge with a little water and form a cone shape, sealing Ф well the dampened edge. Fill the cone with the mixture and press the two dampened edges together to seal the top of the cone. Make sure your Ф samosa is sealed well. Repeat with the remaining pastry. Heat the oil in a large deep saucepan to about 180 °C. Deep fry the samosas in batches of 5 for about 8 minutes until golden and orisp. Drain on kitchen paper. SpeakUp//February/2023

- 13) At the 1970 Isle of Wight Festival, fifty thousand tickets were sold but an estimated six hundred thousand people attended.




