2) People who have left their country and whose request for protection has yet to be evaluated and determined. Each country has their own system for processing their claims and times vary as to how long it may take to reach a conclusion.

3) A broad term that covers all cases where the decision to migrate is taken freely by the individual concerned, for reasons of "personal convenience" and without intervention of external compelling factors. They make the choice about when to leave their home country and where to go. They leave or flee their home to go to new places to seek opportunities or safer and better prospects.

4) Any person coming inside a country from another country usually to resettle permanently. Some of them are legally authorised to be there, others are not and regularly referred to as "illegals".

5) Someone who moves abroad for a limited amount of time or have not decided upon the length of their stay. They are often relocated due to employment and for a specific timeframe. They usually have a lifestyle that is different from the host or home culture and their sense of belonging comes from sharing other people's mobile experiences despite the differences in nationality or cultural heritage.

6) Someone who travels to places other than their usual environment for a short period of time for pleasure, recreation or holiday, or to know different places and cultures.






Curious about Tex-Mex cuisine? The term Tex-Mex (from the words Texan and Mexican) describe food that combines typical elements from Mexico and the south-western United States. The history of Tex-Mex traces back to the times of the Spanish first colonization. Food served on the Spanish missions represents the first intermingling of Native and European foodstuff. Chili con carne was Tex-Mex's first famous export to mainstream America, long before the term "Tex-Mex" was even coined.

Chili

con carne

Ingredients

- I large onion I red pepper 2 garlic cloves, peeled I tablespoon oil I tablespoon hot chili powder I tablespoon paprika I tablespoon cumin 500 grams minced beef I can chopped tomatoes I teaspoon dried marjoram I tablespoon sugar salt pepper
- l can red beans

Method

- Chop I large onion. Chop I red pepper. Finely chop the garlic cloves.
- Put the oil in a pan on medium heat, add the onion and stir for about 5 minutes. Add the garlic, the red pepper, the hot chili powder, paprika and cumin. Let it cook for another 5 minutes, stirring occasionally.
- Add the minced beef. Keep stirring until the meat becomes brown.
- Add the chopped tomatoes, the dried marjoram and sugar, salt and pepper. Add some water if necessary.
- Bring to the boil and put a lid on the pan. Let it simmer for about 20 minutes.
- Stir in the red beans and simmer without lid for 10 minutes, adding a little more water if necessary. Taste and adjust seasoning. Turn off the heat and let it stand for about 10 minutes before serving.



The song was originally written and recorded by American singer-songwriter Dolly Parton in 1973 as both a love letter and breakup note to her duet partner. It was then released by Whitney Houston in 1992 as the lead sinale from the movie The Bodyguard, and is considered one of the greatest vocal performances of a generation, becoming a milestone recording in the history of pop music. In the following years Houston spiralled into drug abuse and her career was derailed by her stormy marriage to singer Bobby Brown, until she drowned in a bathtub in 2012. The words I will always love you are etched on Whitney's gravestone. The song is often misinterpreted as a tune about a couple who will be together forever (and even aets played at some weddinas), but the lyrics are sad; the two lovers know they are not right for each other and one of them has to let the other go.


