Why not try this version of chicken curry from Bradford, the Curry Capital of the UK? It can also be prepared with different meats, vegetables and seafood and it's a fantastic recipe for family dinners.

### **Ingredients**

3 tablespoons vegetable oil I large Spanish onion, thinly sliced

3 tomatoes, in small chunks

I chunk of ginger, grated

2 cloves of garlic, crushed

½ tablespoon of cumin seeds, ground

½ tablespoon of chilli powder

½ tablespoon of salt

½ tablespoon of turmeric powder

3 tablespoons of mixed curry powder

I kg chicken breast, diced in 3 cm pieces

2-3 green chillies

a handful of fresh chopped coriander leaves

# Chicken cwry



### Method

- ◆ In a large pan heat the oil.
- Add the onions and fry until they start to turn golden brown. Add a little water.
- Add the tomatoes, ginger and garlic, and cook for 8-10 minutes.
- Remove from heat, add the cumin seeds, chilli powder, salt, turmeric powder and mixed curry powder.
- Return to heat, add a little water while stirring and cook for 10 minutes.
- Add the chicken and chillies and cook over medium heat till chicken has turned white. Simmer for 25-30 minutes; keep stirring so the spices don't stick to the pan.
- Add the fresh chopped coriander leaves and simmer a further 5 minutes.


