RECIPE 6.4

This Sicily's signature dish is a Mediterranean medley of slowly cooked vegetables which are combined with sugar and vinegar to create a sweet and sour vegetarian stew. While traditional caponata uses deep-fried aubergines, this is an easier and healthier recipe. The dish is high in nutritional value, packed with vitamins, minerals, and antioxidants. Aubergines, olives, onions, basil are potent antioxidant ingredients that may help to lower blood cholesterol, improve heart health and protect the body from inflammation, supporting a strong immune system. Olive oil and pine nuts bring a balanced dose of omega-3 fatty acids, that have been shown to protect the body against damage and aging, and help to improve heart, skin, brain and immune system.



- · Olive oil q.b.
- · 1 kg aubergines, cut into 2.5 cm cubes
- · 250 g shallots, chopped
- 400 g celery sticks, sliced
- · 2 tablespoons capers, soaked if salted
- 200 g pitted green olives in brine
- 50 g toasted pine nuts
- 200 g tomatoes, chopped
- · salt q.b.
- · 50 ml wine vinegar
- · 40 g tomato paste
- · 60 g sugar
- · handful basil leaves

Method

- Pour the olive oil into a large saucepan, place over a medium heat and add the aubergines. Cook for about 15-20 minutes, until soft.
- Scoop the aubergines out of the pan, add the shallots to the saucepan and cook for about 5 minutes until translucent.
- Add the celery and after about 5 minutes put in capers, olives, pine nuts and tomatoes. Add salt and stir gently. Cover with a lid and cook slowly, about 20-25 minutes.
- Using a spoon, mix vinegar, tomato paste and sugar and pour the sauce in the saucepan. Raise the heat and stir thoroughly. Turn off the heat and add the cooked aubergines and the basil.
- Serve warm or at room temperature. The stew should smell sweet and sour.






